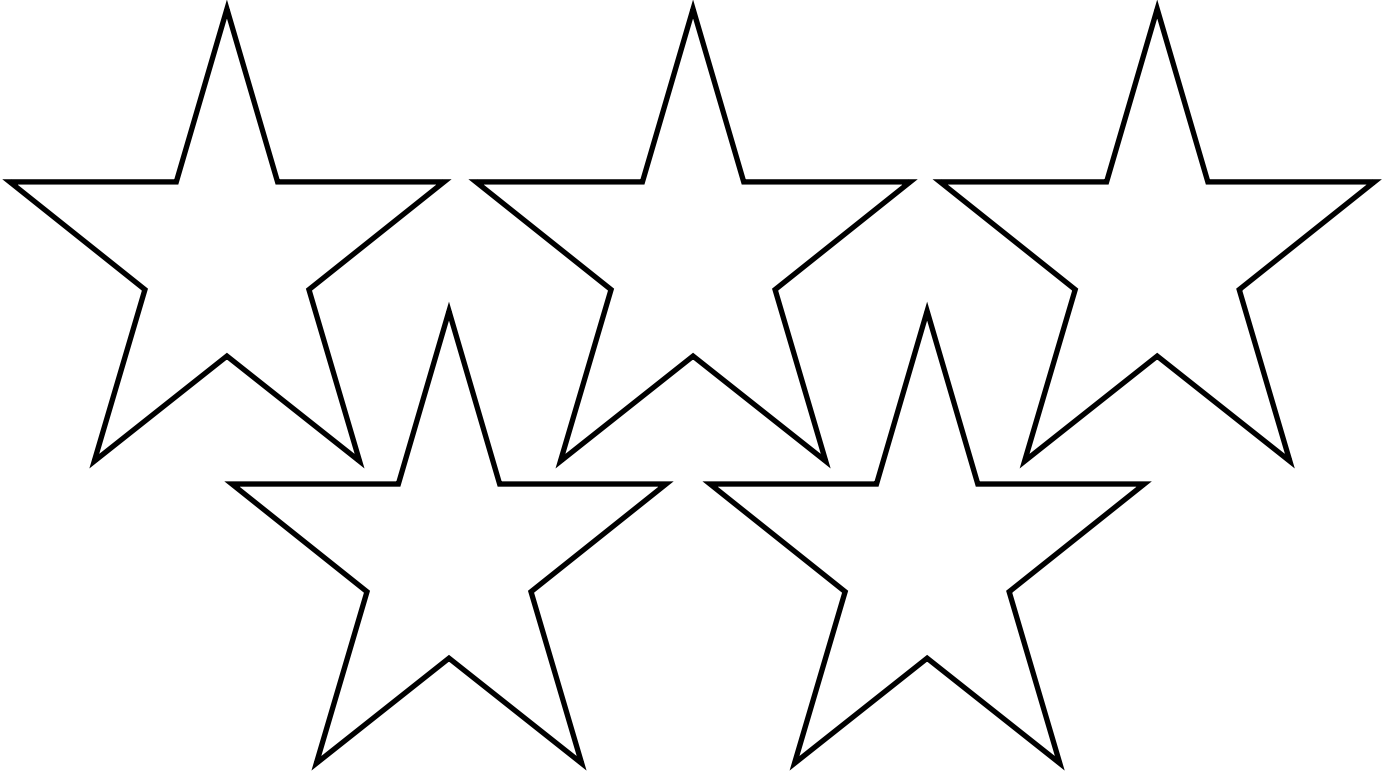


All about you!

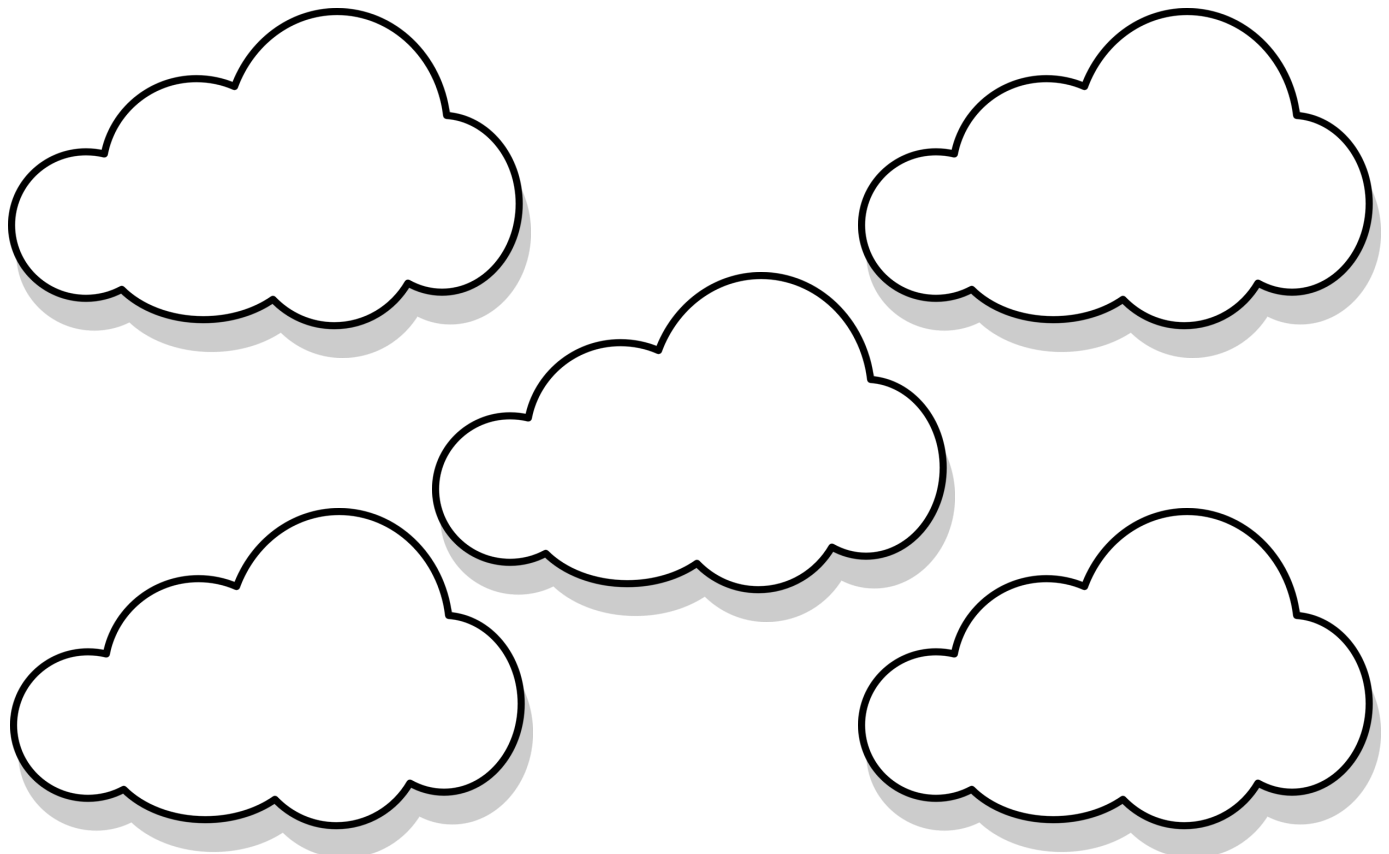
In this section of the booklet it is a chance for you to think 'all about you,' your likes, dislikes, what you are looking forward to and what you may be nervous about.

Think of the things that you are excited about, and write them in the stars below.

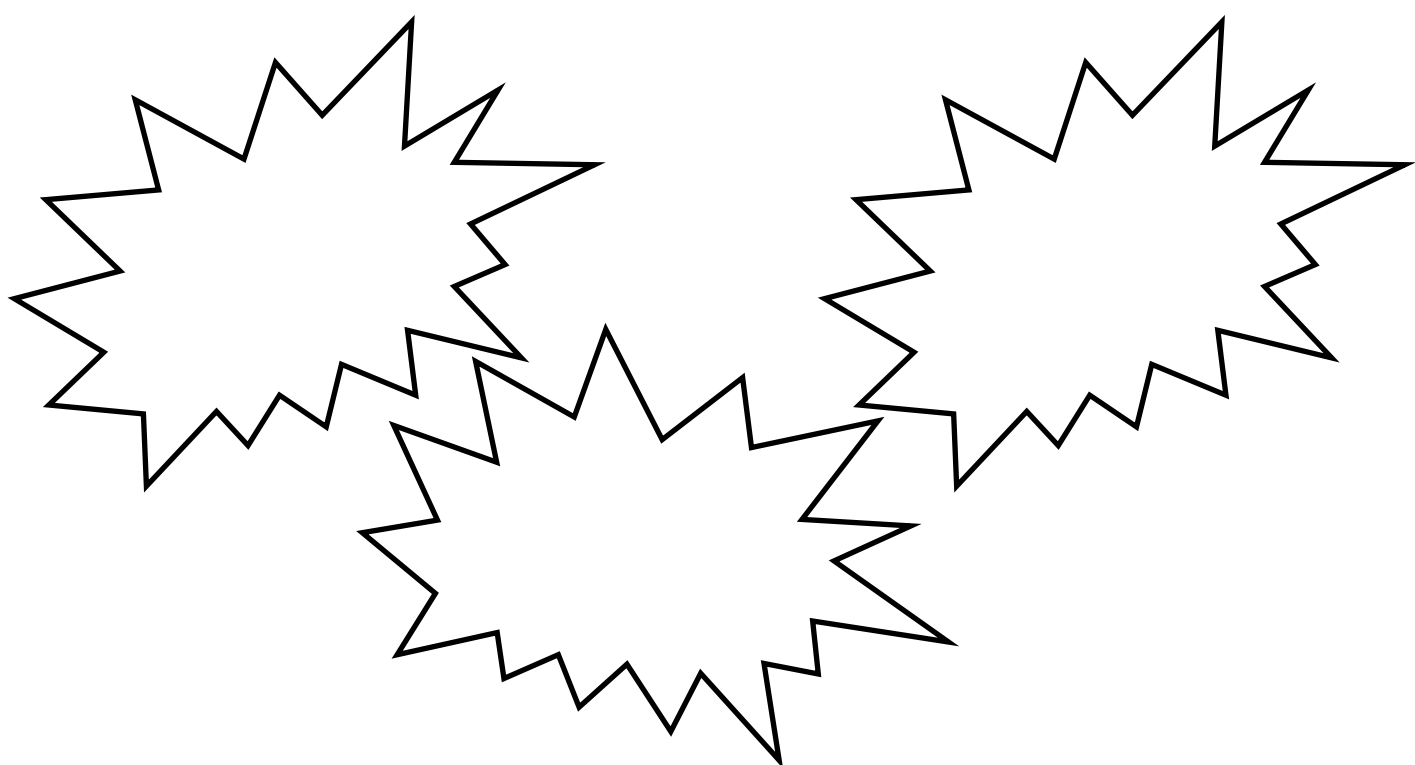


2. Sometimes you might also have worries or questions about starting secondary school. Write these down on the thought clouds below.



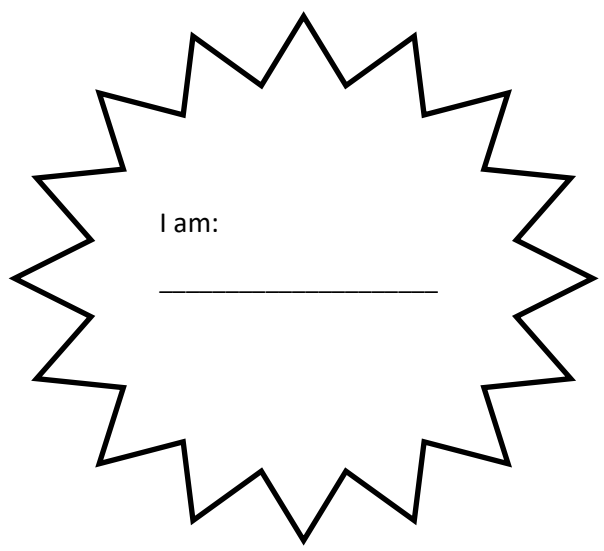
3. Now think about some positive affirmations about starting secondary school, e.g. I am going to try my hardest with every new challenge that comes along.

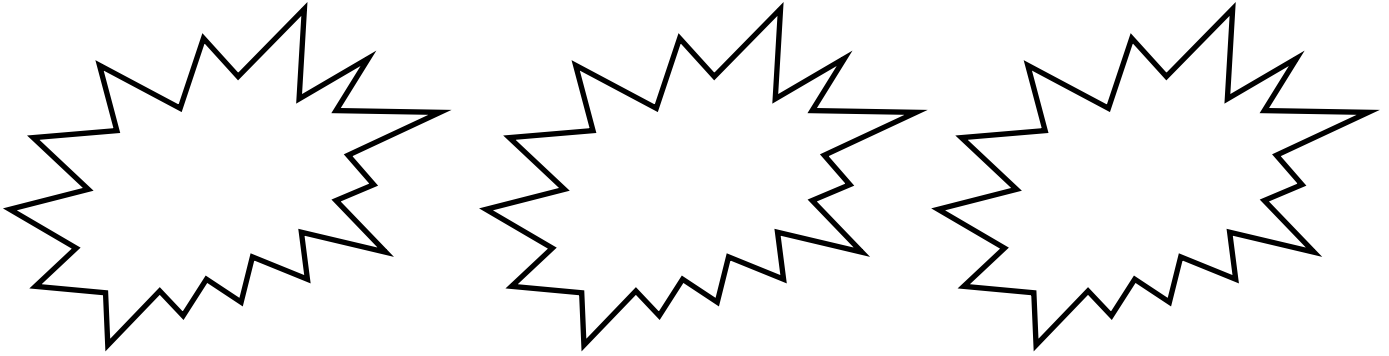

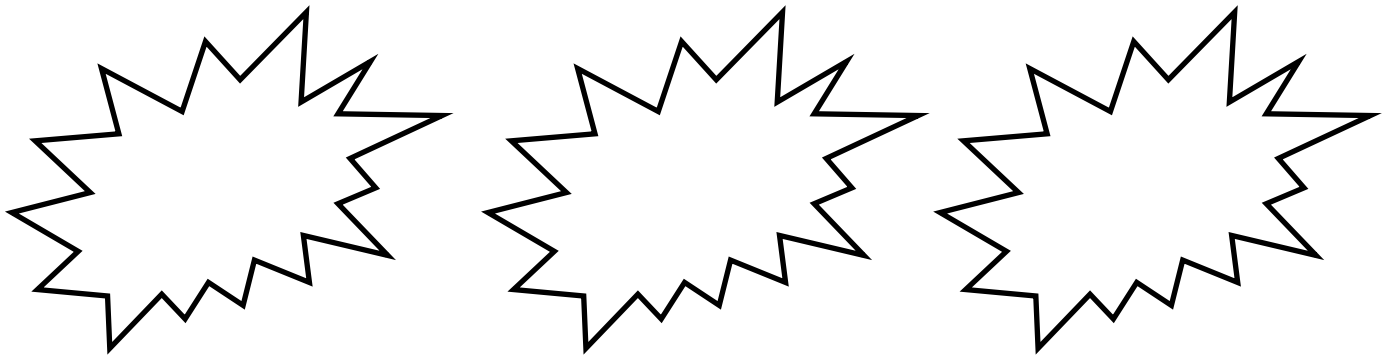

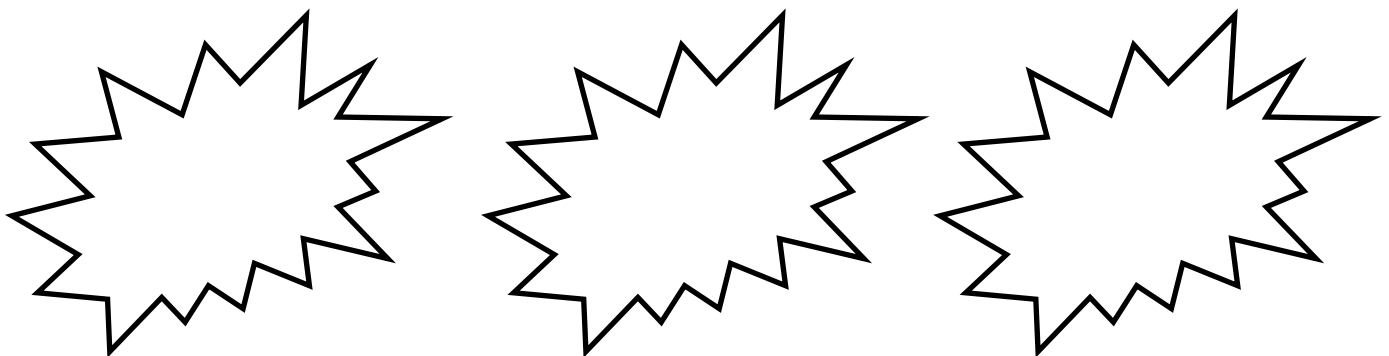
Thinking about your move from primary school to secondary school, write down the things that you might like to know more about, that perhaps haven't been answered in this booklet or on the academy website.
