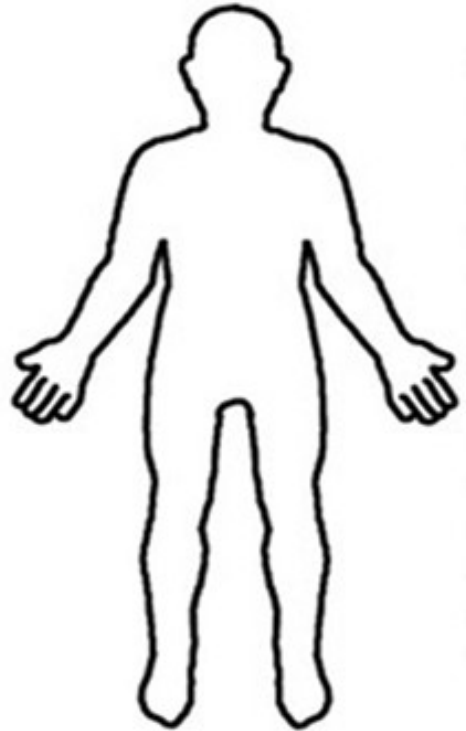


## Drama

Drama is a practical subject, so you will be active, and will explore characterisation, thought tracking, silent action, role-play, devising, costumes, script writing and so much more.

We have 2 drama activities for you to attempt:

**Task 1. Design a costume for a character in a play or film.** You could use a character from 'A Midsummer Nights Dream,' as detailed in the English section, although it can be any character from play or film. Create a detailed costume that is practical, and represents their personality.
