



Return to School Summary September 2020

Safeguarding is of paramount importance. We understand that the COVID19 pandemic can trigger or intensify feelings of anxiety, particularly given that young people have not regularly been in a formal educational setting for a considerable period, including those whom may find changes to routine more challenging.

In order to help best prepare our students for their return to school, this summary is designed to outline the steps we are taking to ensure this is done as safely as possible. Our additional safety measures include:

- Establishing year group bubbles where students from each year group will have:
 - Designated entrances/exits
 - Specific classrooms
 - Allocated toilets
 - o Designated inside and outside social spaces
 - Lunch deliveries to year group areas
 - Access to a range of support/intervention through a designated inclusion provision
- Additional hand sanitiser stations
- A revised behaviour policy to reinforce the expectations of personal hygiene and, where possible, social distancing.
- Enhanced cleaning protocols, focusing on high traffic areas and touch points (e.g. handrails/door handles) and any resources needed across bubbles between each use (e.g. specialist teaching rooms)

Frequently asked questions:

- 1. How are the groups in my classes managed?
 - a. Group changes are reduced, where possible, such as being taught as tutor groups. Teachers move between year areas to reduce student movement around the academy.
- 2. How will I be supported on my return?
 - a. We have invested in additional welfare staff and reorganised the pastoral team based on year groups. You will have a form tutor, as well as a non-teaching pastoral manager and a head of year. The pastoral staff are based in your year area. Alongside this team, there is a member of staff to run our inclusion and support rooms, as well as our safeguarding officer, integration manager, attendance officer and SENDCo to organise support across each year group. Each year group is linked to their head of key stage who is a member of the senior leadership team
- 3. What happens to any interventions or support I used to have?
 - a. Each year area has a designated inclusion room, only accessed by students in that year group. Where possible, we would prefer students to be in lessons to catch up on any lost learning, but we have a team ready to assist you with any difficulties you experience in order to support this aim.
